Thomas Rothman is a City Planner for the City of Los Angeles where he currently manages the Planning Department's Code Studies unit. The unit is responsible for Zoning Code amendments related to land use issues, including sustainable communities, green building, parking, community care facilities, mixed-use housing, medical marijuana dispensaries, eldercare facilities, and code reform efforts.

During his 12-year tenure in Los Angeles, Mr. Rothmann has drafted a number of citywide ordinances for review by the City Planning Commission and City Council, including that City's proposed ordinance affecting residential care facilities, boarding houses, and group homes for parolees.

Prior to joining Los Angeles, Mr. Rothmann worked for the Citywide Administrative Services for the City of New York where he directed the Land Use Planning Unit. He holds a Master of Public Administration degree with specializations in public policy and urban planning from New York University.
