

GUIDELINE A.02 – Haunted Houses

A.02.1 PURPOSE

This guideline is intended to provide safety standards and regulation construction and operation of structures used as haunted houses

A.02.2 SCOPE

These regulations shall apply to temporary Haunted Hou, as, whost walks, or similar operations open to the public where combustible decoral caterial and confusing sounds and/or visual effects are present. The requirements the California Building Code (CBC), California Fire Code (CFC), and Code of Regulations (CCR), Title 19.

A.02.3 DEFINITIONS

"Amusement Building: Any building or poor in ereof, temporary or permanent, used for entertainment or educational puresses which contains a system that transports passengers or process a walking through a course so arranged that the required means of exists, and to theatrical distractions, disguise or visual obstructions, is not applied.

PERMITS REQUIRED

An element buildings shall be permitted through the City of Newport Beach mmunity Development Department/Building Division.

Haunted houses shall be permitted through the City of Newport Beach Fire Department, Life Safety Services Division.

Additional Special Event permits may be required by the City of Newport Beach Recreation and Senior Services Department.

A.02.5 PROCEDURE

A minimum of two (2) weeks prior to the event, a permit application and be submitted to the Newport Beach Fire Department, Life Safety Services with a The Permit application shall include the following:

- A dimensional site/floor plan indicating the proximit or the childing to other structures or hazardous areas and paths of any from the event building or area to the public way.
- Dimensions indicating total square foot exits; aisles and interior exit pathways.
- Locations of all exits, illuminated exists and all emergency lighting units.
- Location of all fire extinguishers.
- Location of all electrons and light switches.
- Location of all ske traces and/or fire alarm panels.
- Location fall positions at the event.

An Emergence of the submitted and shall include the following:

- strip occupancy load (including all staff). Life Safety Services strip who saist you in determining the correct occupancy load. A signing the maximum occupant capacity shall be posted in a visible ation near the entrance and event staff shall control the flow of patrons so not to exceed the maximum occupancy limit.
 - A written emergency procedure plan shall be submitted along with the permit application packet. All employees shall be trained in emergency evacuation procedures. The emergency procedures plan shall include training of staff members and familiarization with the fire alarm signal. Specific personnel shall be designated to turn off all distracting noises

- (i.e., the sound system) and turn on all lights when alerted by either the fire alarm system or otherwise notified of an emergency condition.
- Two (2) exits shall be provided from each room with an occupant load fifty (50) or more. Required exit doors shall swing in the difference egress travel.
- Illuminated exit signs, with battery back-up, shall be provided at a chexit
- Maximum travel distance to the nearest exit shall no extract the extraction of the extrac
- Exit doors serving an occupancy load of fifty (see or more vall have panic hardware.
- Emergency lighting, with battery bases shade provided in all rooms, areas, and exit pathways.
- Exhibit and decorative materials obstruct, confuse, or obscure exits, exit pathways, exit signs, or entire gency lighting units.

Note: Additional part as arking, including low-level markings and signs may be required at a time. Fire Department inspection.

Fire Protection.

- Automosphere systems, when provided, shall not be obstructed or altered

n activation of the smoke detection or fire sprinkler systems, all concasing sounds and visual effects shall stop; activate approved ectional exit markings; and cause illumination of the means of egress with light of not less than one (1) foot candle at the walking surface.

A public address system that is audible throughout the amusement structure shall be provided.

• All fire extinguishers shall have a minimum rating of 3A:40BC, and be properly mounted between three (3) and five (5) feet from the floor to the top of the extinguisher. All extinguishers must be visible and accessible all times and clearly illuminated or marked with reflective tap. Extinguishers must be located within seventy-five (75) feet travel istantifrom any point in the structure.

Electrical.

- All extension cords shall be a heavy commercial op Use is d, not subject to mechanical damage, in good condition, and ap opriate for their use.
- Only UL Listed power strips, with over-construction, shall be used when the number of outlets provided is inational owner strips shall be plugged directly into provided outled and shall be plugged into other power strips. All extension cords and one strips shall be protected from foot traffic.
- Alteration of the building's electrical pirity will require a permit from the Newport Beach Community Development Department/Building Division.

Decorative Materials.

- me tial not appropriately labeled as fire retardant shall be flame ed and will be required to be removed if it is combustible.

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- Use of smoke generators may be restricted if they are determined to be incompatible with smoke detectors.
 - "NO SMOKING" signs shall be provided at the entrance to the exhibit.

- Storage and/or use of flammable or combustible liquids, gasses and solids are prohibited.
- Open flames and open flame devices are prohibited.
- Good housekeeping shall be maintained throughout the exhibit exit pathways.
- All emergency staff shall carry flashlights and known be cather of all exits, fire extinguishers, light switches, electrical puels and gency phones.
- Phone communication shall be readily available for the playose of calling 911 in the event of an emergency.
- A fire drill involving all staff mem pay required prior to event opening.
