









#### City Charter Section 1005

- Every 10 Years (following the National Census)
- Council-appointed Redistricting Ad-Hoc Committee
- Districts must be "fair and logical"
- Districts must provide "contiguous and compact territories"
- Districts must provide "fair representation"

## Formation and Role of Council Ad-Hoc Committee

- Up to Three (3) Members from the City Council
- Brown Act Committee Public Notice and Agenda
- Committee will Review Census 2020 Data Results and Redistricting Mapping Options
- Consider Public Input
- Report Recommended Map(s) back to City Council for Final Adoption



# FAIR MAPS Act 2020 (AB 849) Timing and Requirements

- Adopt New Maps by April 15, 2022
- Four (4) Public Hearings
  - One Prior to Draft Map(s) Release
  - Two After Draft Map(s) Released
  - One Held on the Weekends (Sat/Sun) or after 6 PM Monday through Friday
  - Public Hearing must take place at the time it is noticed
  - Redistricting Ad-Hoc Committee can count towards the required Public Hearings
