- Much as the consultant has been doing for the remainder of the General Plan Update, the committee may wish to consider the general principles that will underlie its ultimate recommendations for new and revised policies. Possibilities include:
  - We recognize noise pollution degrades quality of life.
  - We seek to minimize our population's exposure to unwanted sound.
  - We seek to preserve our City's quiet areas and improve its noisy ones.
  - We believe regulation should be limited to that necessary.
- Objective: Group to attempt to agree on the principles that will guide its policy review.
